



COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS): VISITOR POLICY

In response to the coronavirus pandemic, St Peter's School, York has implemented a strict visitor policy to safeguard the health and wellbeing of the whole school community. We ask that all non-essential visitors stay away from the school at this time.

Our policy has been developed in accordance with the advice and guidance given by Public Health England (PHE), the Boarding Schools' Association (BSA), the government's guidance document 'Coronavirus (COVID-19): implementing protective measures in education and childcare settings' and supported by our in-house medical team.

To protect all in the school community, we would ask anyone who meets the following criteria not to visit the school until they have completed the specified self-isolation period and remained symptom-free.

Please do not visit the school if you have a high temperature and / or new continuous cough and / or loss of taste or smell (or other symptoms of COVID 19); have had a positive COVID 19 test within the last 14 days; have been in close contact with anyone who has these symptoms and / or has had a positive COVID 19 test in the last 14 days (whether within your own household or if advised of contact by the Government's Test and Trace service); you have arrived from abroad within the last 14 days from a country where the UK Government requires quarantine on arrival.

Parents / guardians must not enter any school buildings unless a prior appointment has been made with the School.

Only essential other visitors, such as those needed to undertake essential maintenance, or those providing a specialist service will be allowed on site and normally only by prior arrangement.

All visitors must report to the relevant School Reception.

Delivery drivers must only come to the Estates department via the Rise gates.

Social distancing must be maintained by visitors at all times.

Please ensure you have a face covering with you as you may be required to wear it in communal areas.
