The lessons are arranged on a rotating basis except for those given to pupils in the Sixth Form (St Peter's) or those involving a second instrument, which are arranged outside the academic timetable. Lessons missed through unavoidable absence of the teacher will be made up, but lessons missed by the pupil will not be made up unless it is convenient to do so. Music reports will be included in the regular school reports. Written notice received during the summer holiday will lead to lessons stopping at October half term. Written notice received during the first half of the Christmas term will lead to lessons stopping at the end of the Christmas term. Written notice received during the second half of the Christmas term will lead to lessons stopping at February half term. Written notice received during the Christmas holiday will lead to lessons stopping at the end of the Easter term. Written notice received during the first half of the Easter term will lead to lessons stopping at the end of the Easter term. Written notice received during the second half of the Easter term will lead to lessons stopping at May half term. Written notice received during the Easter holiday or up to the end of the summer term will lead to lessons stopping at the end of the Summer term (unless pupils opt out of lessons in study leave). This notice period is in place to protect the pupil lists of employed staff and is in line with practice in other schools. Experience has also taught us that it is important to give enough time to make sure that the correct decision has been reached (it is better to go on too long than stop too early). Instruments may be hired from the school for one year in the first instance, after which time the instrument may be required for another pupil. Parents/Guardians are responsible for loss or damage to any instrument so hired and it is a condition of hire that you include the instrument on your home contents policy and
