

General Appearance

St Peter's 2-8

We ask that long hair is tied back with plain navy accessories and should be tidy in appearance. All pupils should have natural hair colouring.

Coats must be purchased from Schoolblazer. Accessories e.g. scarves and gloves must be plain and navy blue.

No jewellery may be worn except for earrings. Ears may be pierced once in one ear and plain gold, or silver studs only. They must be removed for Games and PE. Watches/Fitbits may be worn however smart watches are not permitted.

School skirt length should be at least just below the knee. Shirt sleeves are not to be rolled up on long sleeve shirts. Short sleeved option available.

Make up and nail varnish may not be worn.

St Peter's 8-13

Hair should be neat and tidy and a natural colour. Long hair must be tied back for all lessons, including games, science, art and DT.

No jewellery may be worn except for earrings. Ears may be pierced once in one ear and plain gold, or silver studs only. They must be removed for Games and PE. Watches/Fitbits may be worn however smart watches are not permitted.

Year 7 and 8 must wear their school blazers when arriving at and leaving school.

Coats/anoraks should be navy in colour, not be scruffy or ostentatious. Accessories e.g. scarves and gloves must be plain and navy blue.

School skirt length should be at least just below the knee. Shirt sleeves are not to be rolled up on long sleeve shirts. Short sleeved option available.

Light make-up such as concealer/foundation may be worn. No eye make-up permitted. Nail varnish may not be worn.

Third, Fourth and Fifth Form

Hair should be neat and tidy and a natural colour. Long hair must be tied back for games, science, art and DT.

No jewellery may be worn except for earrings. Ears may be pierced once in one ear and plain gold, or silver studs only. They must be removed for Games and PE. Watches/Fitbits may be worn however smart watches are not permitted.

School blazers must be worn when arriving at and leaving school.

School skirt length should be at least just below the knee. Shirt sleeves are not to be rolled up on long sleeve shirts. Short sleeved option available.

Light make-up such as concealer/ foundation may be worn. No eye make-up permitted. Nail varnish may not be worn.

Sixth Form

The overriding principle is that the Sixth Form uniform must be smart, practical, formal and reflect the working environment of St Peter's School at all times during the working school day.

In all matters, the school's decision regarding the appropriateness of appearance/dress is final. It is better for pupils to discuss something with a member of staff if they are unsure, rather than testing it out.

Hair should be tidy and of a natural colour. Hair should be cut in conventional styles. No steps, lines, 'overhangs' or 'buzz cuts' are permitted. No extreme variation in length of hair. Beards, moustaches, and other forms of facial hair are not permitted.

Make up must be discreet. Nail varnish must be of one colour. Nails should be neat and of a practical length for school.

Discreet jewellery may be worn. One necklace, one ring per hand and discreet earrings are permitted. Facial/body piercings and tattoos should not be visible.

Music

Plain black polo shirts are standard wear for performing in most concerts - they are available to purchase from Schoolblazer.

Formal Occasions

For formal occasions such as the Carol Service and Commemoration pupils must ensure that their uniform is looking at its 'best' i.e. clean, pressed and shoes polished.
